What does the image of a shepherd tell us about God's care for us? Shepherding was one of the oldest of callings in Israel, even before farming, since the Chosen People had travelled from place to place, living in tents, and driving their flocks from one pasture to another. Looking after sheep was no easy calling. It required great skill and courage. Herds were often quite large, thousands or even ten thousands of sheep. Do you know the peace and security of a life freely submitted to Jesus, the Good Shepherd? In the person of the Lord Jesus we see the unceasing vigilance and patience of God's love. In our battle against sin and evil, Jesus is ever ready to give us

help, strength, and refuge. Do you trust in his grace and help at all times?

GUIDANCE REGARDING COMMUNAL WORSHIP

Under present restrictions we can accommodate approximately 140 people at each Mass. (Six people or two household every other pew). After reaching this number we may need to lock the church doors (Sunday, 9.00am and 11.00am). To avoid disappointment please attend **additional Mass at 12.30pm.**

We now have an Offertory Collection and Procession with Offertory Gifts. The collectors will go from both side of the bench as passing of the basket from one to another is not allowed. Therefore, for each Mass, at least 4 collectors are needed. **Second collection** will take place as we leave the church. Also, The **Prayer of the Faithful** will follow the Creed.

PLEASE DO NOT attend the Church if you or someone you live with starts to show symptoms: a high temperature, a new, continuous cough, a loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste or you have been in contact with someone who has the virus. Please hand sanitise upon entering and leaving the Church.

- Always wear a face covering. Please keep social distance at all times when in the Church. Please use the Government Track & Trace system using the QR code on display in the Church or complete the form provided.
- During Mass we are currently not allowed to join in with the singing.
- It must cover both your mouth and nose at all times, except for the consumption of Holy Communion. We receive Body of Christ only.

As the country moves into step 4 (19th July 2021) a new guidance will apply. The priority is for the church to be a safe place to enter and worship. Therefore we will need to take into account the actual situation regarding the virus in our area. We will be able to have more people in the church but we need to consider many other things including face coverings, and congregational singing. We will be considering this in the next days and let you know.
